Faculty Licensure

Hiring a new faculty member requires program administrators to complete 2 steps from the Board's perspective.

#1. Complete and submit the Nurse Faculty/Clinical Instructor Record form within 30 days of hire. Very often we receive these forms are submitted after the person has already started working at the college/university.

#2. Validate that the person holds an active nursing license within the state that he/she will be teaching: This piece is critical.

Please note that submission of the nurse faculty/clinical instructor record **does not** preclude successful completion of the endorsement process as stipulated by KRS Chapter 314 for individuals not presently holding Kentucky licensure. In accordance with 201 KAR 20:310, 1.3(c), "The nurse faculty in all educational programs whose faculty prepares students for licensure as registered nurses shall hold a temporary work permit or a current license to practice as a registered nurse in the Commonwealth of Kentucky." **An individual not possessing either Kentucky licensure or a temporary work permit shall not work in a prelicensure program of nursing within Kentucky.** Beginning work prior to receiving their KY license can make the new faculty member subject to disciplinary action on their license. In essence, they are practicing nursing without a license.

Please contact Debbie to ensure your new hire is in compliance before she starts work.

The college has a regulatory responsibility to file a Nurse Faculty/Clinical Instructor Record to notify KBN of an individual's intended position within their program. But that requirement does not substitute for that individual's personal requirement to obtain a Kentucky nursing license. Please urge your new hire to expedite completion of the appropriate paperwork to ensure she is "legal" and in compliance with KRS Chapter 314 and 201 KAR 20:310..

Address Changes for Licensees

Kentucky Administrative Regulation 201 KAR 20:370, Section 1(11), requires a licensee to notify the Board upon establishment of a new mailing address. **Nursing licensees can routinely update their mailing address online by clicking on the link below, and following the instructions on the menu screen.** Address changes will no longer be accepted through e-mail.
