	Prescriptions for psycho-stimulants may be written for a <i>thirty (30) day supply only</i> by an advanced practice registered nurse certified in psychiatric health nursing.							
	Prescriptions for Schedule III controlled substances must be limited to a <i>thirty (30) day supply without any refill.</i>							
	Prescriptions for Schedules IV and V controlled substances must be limited to the original prescription and refills not to exceed a <i>six (6) month supply.</i>
