

Regulatory Changes

The Board approved revisions to 201 KAR 20:320 - Standards for Curriculum of Pre-Licensure Registered Nurse and Practical Nurse Programs.

- Specifically revisions were made to Section 4, Use of External Examinations. The definition of an "external examination" was further expanded to include norm-referenced examinations designed to compare and rank test takers in relation to one another. Additionally, the following were added:
 - A program of nursing that utilizes an external examination as the basis for requiring student remediation shall ensure that completion of remediation occurs within the same semester or quarter.
 - The academic progression policy of the program of nursing shall clearly outline the role of the external examination in remediation.
 - A program of nursing shall not require students who have completed all requirements for graduation to earn a specific score or benchmark on an external examination as a condition for graduation or for placing the student's name on the Certified List of Kentucky Program of Nursing Graduates pursuant to 201 KAR 20:070.

KENTUCKY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Kentucky Administrative Regulations are enacted to operationalize statutory language and carry force and effect of law. Administrative regulations were revised during FY 2020 (July 1, 2019– June 30, 2020) as indicated by the effective date, and are available on the Legislative Research Commission's website.

On March 30, 2020, the Governor signed Senate Bill 150 (2020) into law. Section 13 of this bill and Executive Orders 2020-243 and 2020-257 authorized the Kentucky Board of Nursing to modify statutory and regulatory provisions, where appropriate, to eliminate barriers to licensure caused by social distancing requirements and to ensure the continuation of Board support of Life-Sustaining Businesses. Portions of Kentucky Revised Statutes and Kentucky Administrative Regulations were modified during the COVID-19 State of Emergency including: 201 KAR 20:056 (APRN licensure and certification requirements), 201 KAR 20:057 (Scope and standards of practice of APRNs), 201 KAR 20:070 (Licensure by examination), 201 KAR 20:110 (Licensure by endorsement), 201 KAR 20:225 (Reinstatement of licenses), 201 KAR 20:320 (Standards for curriculum of pre-licensure registered nurse and practical nurse programs), and 201 KAR 20:470 (Dialysis technician credentialing requirements and training program standards).

In addition, KRS 314.101(1)(a,e) and the Good Samaritan Act of 2007, KRS 39A.350-366, authorize nurses who are licensed to practice in another state and credentialed dialysis technicians to provide medical care to patients in Kentucky during the COVID-19 State of Emergency by applying for and being accepted on the Registry for Out-of-State Licensees to Practice in Kentucky During COVID-19 State of Emergency.


On March 26, 2020, the Kentucky Office of the Inspector General provided guidance to allow for long-term care facilities to train and hire Personal Care Attendants during the COVID-19 State of Emergency. This temporary waiver permits a long-term care facility to employ a trained Personal Care Attendant to perform defined resident care procedures that do not require the skill or training required for a State Registered Nurse Aide. The Kentucky Board of Nursing is responsible for maintaining the Personal Care Attendant Registry.

FINANCIAL OPERATIONS

The Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN) is a 100% fee supported agency utilizing no General Fund revenues. The bulk of the revenues realized by KBN are the result of licensing fees which are assessed annually. A fee structure breakdown is listed to the right of this narrative. Fiscal year 2019-2020 receipts totaled \$7,994,940 with outgoing expenditures totaling \$7,511,700 which serve to support statewide functions as detailed in this report.

The Kentucky Board of Nursing offers various publications and informational materials online and in publication format ranging from no cost to the public to the recovery of duplication and/or distribution charges. The KBN distributed \$411,000 in scholarship monies in FY 2019-2020 to promote the continued growth of Nursing in Kentucky and its historically underserved areas. The balance of receipts remaining after expenditures are utilized to carry the agency through the first quarter of the following year until the licensure renewal process produces additional funds.




SUMMARY OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS 2014-2015 TO 2019-2020


The Compliance Branch monitors nursing licensees that have been placed on probation by a decision of the Kentucky Board of Nursing or have signed an Agreed Order with the Board, as well as participants who have requested admission and are being monitored by the Kentucky Alternative Recovery Effort (KARE) for Nurses Program.

The purpose of the KARE for Nurses Program is to protect and safeguard the health of the citizens of the Commonwealth by monitoring nurses whose abilities to provide nursing care are compromised by a substance use disorder. The foundation of the KARE for Nurses Program is that substance use disorders are treatable and that the nurse's recovery and return to competent nursing practice is in the best interest of both the nurse and public health.




KARE PROGRAM ADMISSIONS: FY 13-14 TO 19-20

KARE PROGRAM COMPLETIONS, SURRENDERS, & TERMINATIONS: FY 13-14 TO 19-20







NURSING INCENTIVE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Nursing Incentive Scholarship Fund (NISF) provides scholarships to Kentucky residents for attending approved pre-licensure nursing programs (registered nurse or practical nurse) or graduate nursing programs. Scholarship recipients must work as nurses in Kentucky for one year for each academic year funded. To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must have been admitted to a nursing program. Applications for scholarships are accepted from January 1 to June 1. The amount of each scholarship is \$3,000 per year, or \$1,500 per semester. If a recipient does not complete the nursing program within the time frame specified by the program, or if the recipient does not complete the required employment, then the recipient is required to repay any NISF monies awarded, plus accrued interest.

During FY 2019-2020 148 NISF awards were granted—31 were continuation awards and 117 were new awards. The total amount awarded was \$411,000.



NURSING EDUCATION


The Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN) is the legally authorized body in the Commonwealth to approve programs of nursing preparing persons for eligibility for licensure as nurses. Through the provisions of the Kentucky Nursing Laws and applicable Kentucky Administrative Regulations, the Board prescribes standards for educational institutions offering programs preparing candidates for licensure as nurses. As of June 30, 2020, there were a total of 15 Baccalaureate Nursing (BSN) programs, 36 Associate Degree (ADN) programs, and 25 Practical Nursing (PN) programs approved by the KBN.



CONTINUING EDUCATION/COMPETENCY

As a mechanism to promote continuing competency, the *Kentucky Nursing Laws* (KRS 314.073) mandate that licensees shall be required to document continuing competency during the immediate past licensure period as prescribed in regulations promulgated by the Board. KBN is the Commonwealth agency legally authorized to approve providers of mandatory CE. During FY 20, according to KBN Administrative Regulation 201 KAR 20:215, validation of CE/competency must have included one of the following:

- 1. Proof of having earned 14 approved contact hours; OR
- 2. A national certification or recertification related to the nurse's practice role (in effect during the whole period or initially earned during the period); **OR**
- 3. Completion of a nursing research project as principal investigator, coinvestigator, or project director. Must have been qualitative or quantitative in nature, utilized research methodology, and included a summary of the findings; **OR**
- 4. Publication of a nursing related article; OR
- 5. A professional nursing continuing education presentation that was developed by the presenter, presented to nurses or other health professionals, and evidenced by a program brochure, course syllabi, or a letter from the offering provider identifying the licensee's participation as the presenter of the offering; **OR**
- Participation as a preceptor for at least one nursing student or new employee undergoing orientation (must have been for at least 120 hours, have had a one-to-one relationship with student or employee, may have precepted more than one student during the 120 hours, and preceptorship shall have been evidenced by written documentation from the educational institution or preceptor's supervisor); OR
- 7. Proof of having earned 7 approved contact hours, **PLUS** a nursing employment evaluation that was satisfactory for continued employment (must have been signed by supervisor with the name, address, and phone number of the employer included), and covered at least 6 months of the earning period.
- 8. College courses, designated by a nursing course number, and courses in physical and social sciences counted toward CE hours. One semester credit hour equaled 15 contact hours; one quarter credit hour equaled 12 contact hours.

Audit Responses

KBN received eight hundred and eight (808) responses to the audit, a ninety-four percent (94%) response rate.

Six hundred eighty-eight (688) of the total number of individuals audited were approved for compliance, an eighty percent (80%) compliance rate of the total audited.

Non-Compliant Individuals

A total of one hundred twenty (120) nurses who submitted documents for the 2019 CE audit were deemed to be non-compliant for the November 1, 2019 – October 31, 2020 earning period.

Forty-eight (48) of nurse selected for the audit failed to respond to requests for submission of proof of completion of continuing competency requirements.


COMMUNICATIONS

Presentations

Kentucky Board of Nursing staff provided a total of thirty-five (35) presentations during fiscal year 2019 – 2020, attended by approximately 1,266 individuals.



Educational Presentations for Programs of Nursing

KBN staff held four (4) PN/RN Education Regulations – Faculty Essentials programs during the year to educate nursing faculty on the education regulations and operations of the Board of Nursing and held three (3) APRN Education Regulations - Faculty Essentials programs.

COVID-19 Pandemic KBN Questions and Answers Webinars

KBN began receiving inquiries related to COVID-19 in March. To address concerns, KBN staff developed and provided question and answer webinars, in addition to the presentations listed above. These question and answer webinars provided information related to the state of emergency and the pandemic's effect on programs of nursing, nurse educators, clinical requirements, credentialing, and licensing matters.

Practice Inquiries


Kentucky Board of Nursing staff received several inquiries daily via phone and email on a number of practice related issues. Questions related to medication prescribing, dispensing and the collaborative agreement for the APRN's prescriptive authority (CAPA) are the most common inquiries accounting for sixty-one percent (61%) of all APRN inquiries and thirty-one percent (31%) of all inquiries. Questions related to RNs regarding unlicensed assistive personnel, mainly delegation, account for twenty-eight (28%) of all RN inquiries and seven percent (7%) of all inquiries. For LPNs the most common questions are related to the LPN's Scope of Practice in infusion therapy, accounting for twenty-three percent (23%) or seven percent (7%) of all inquiries.

Practice Inquiries Responded to Via Telephone

In January of 2020, Professional Support Branch began tracking practice inquiries responded to via telephone. During this six (6) month period a total of two hundred ninety-three (293) phone calls were logged.

Credentials Branch Inquiries Responded to Via Telephone and Email

In January of 2020, Credentials Branch began tracking inquiries responded to via telephone and email. During this six (6) month period a total of nine thousand one hundred and eighty-two (9,182) phone calls and emails were logged.













CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALISTS FY 18-19 TO 19-20 COMPARATIVE SUMMARY
