CLASS DESCRIPTION

The **Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner** (SANE) didactic course is provided over 5 days (40 hours) and satisfies the first portion of the KBN requirements for the SANE credential.

The second portion required for completion to SANE credentialing, is a 60-hour varied clinical experience. This can be coordinated through local or regional agencies/resources and through the assistance of local SANEs. The class will address sexual assault in adolescents, 14 years or older, and adults. There will be 40 CEU's for nurses attending the entire didactic portion.

Instruction manuals will be provided the first day of class.

The instructors will be local members of the SART, as well as, experts from the Office of the Fayette Commonwealth's Attorney and the Kentucky State Police Laboratory.
